






2. CRAFTING A DATA AND ANALYTICS (D&A) STRATEGY

Key Takeaway: A unified D&A strategy can maximize its enterprise impact and deliver meaningful insights.




3. ADDRESSING EVOLVING SECURITY THREATS

The Solution:






Define Clear Accountability:

The Challenge:


Eighty-one percent of boards have yet to achieve digital transformation goals, leaving CIOs under pressure to justify IT investments amid growing demands.
